


A renaissance of rent control in Europe

- Shortage of affordable housing is a chronic problem of urban areas.
- It follows a cyclical pattern.
- Since 48 BC, governments tend to address it by applying rent control.
- Since 2010s, a renaissance of rent control worldwide.
- Especially, in the wake of
 - COVID-19,
 - energy crisis,
 - and Ukraine's war.

More and more countries restrict rents

Meta-study of rent control effects


Sources: 206 empirical studies.
